Land Trust

\$28,000 carryover, \$99,000 distribution, \$127,000 available for next year.

8-10 aides for 2022-2023 will cost \$110,000

Also includes training, materials for enrichment

Split positions are frowned upon at the district level due to scheduling and budget issues. Might do it.

High enrichment groups are planned by the teacher in sixth and by the aides in lower grades. Activities usually are part of the class curriculum.

Renzulli- a program they are considering that allows kids to pick subject to study. Similar to Great Brain, Land School. Has virtual fieldtrips and other resources. Program might cost \$3000.

TSSA Plan Review

Keep in similar to this year- Continue to support walk to read, Teacher training, partial cost for literacy coach, and school initiatives.

Professional development- a coach observes teachers and makes feedback, district literacy coach does data analysis for Acadience. Acadience/Lexia testing is funded by the state. Teachers are learning about Jamboard and Canva.

Teachers have been trained on the new material and components and new reading data. Two days over the summer. K-3 teachers have received the first few sessions of LETRS training through Lexia company.

Next year we'll have 4 teachers for k, 1st, 4th, and 4 ½ for 5th and 6th.

Could we add keyboarding next year? The idea last year was that the STEM teacher would teach keyboarding and they'd practice in the classroom. It hasn't happened well this year.

School based initiatives- Chromebooks, materials for walk to read, subs for TSSA for PLC sessions with the literacy coach k-3, teacher stipends for curriculum mapping and planning, Really Great Reading stipends, coaching cycle stipend
